# A FRIENDLY REMINDER ABOUT DOG CONTROL

When walking your dogs on the town oval, please ensure you are in complete control of your animal at <u>all times</u> and dispose of any waste in the rubbish bins provided by Council.

The Shire of Meekatharra provide the Town Oval as the only off-lease exercise area in town—at all other locations your dog must, according to law, be collared and restrained.

To allow your dog to be unrestrained in public is an offence in the Dog Act 1976.

Being responsible for a dog that attacks a person causing injury is also an offence which attracts a significant penalty of up to \$10,000.

Please be a responsible pet owner—keep your dog restrained when exercising them to avoid both injury to bystanders, and significant penalties, and please pick up any droppings left behind. Nobody wants to step in that!!

The Shire of Meekatharra support the neutering and desexing of pets to reduce the number of strays, and provide sponsorship to the Murdoch Veterinary Clinic to attend Meekatharra to provide this service at no cost to health care card holders. Additionally, the Shire fund regular visiting vet service—Newman Veterinary Clinic—to the value of \$5,000 to neuter the pets of health care card holders at no cost to the owner.

Local residents can access this service by attending the Shire Office to present your Health Care Card and prove registration. You will be issued with a voucher for the appropriate service at the visiting clinic.

The CRC is slated to move into the rear section, and expressions of interest are invited for engagement of the street front café, hairdresser and internal shop spaces. The new Plaza offers a spacious conference room with all the mod cons, a pleasant and shady rear outdoor area, a wide central street-front public mall with tree-planter seating, free WIFI and plenty of easy parking in central Main Street.

Many people are buried all over the outback, but many early graves are lost to the sands of time. It was often the case that the only marker was a hand-carved piece of wood, which soon crumbled away, leaving no trace. At some historic cemeteries, it is sadly the case that people will steal turn of the century iron grave markers. In these modern times, Ground Penetrating Radar is used to confirm cemetery burial sites, sometimes with an occasional surprise when an unmarked underground tenant appears on the screen. Local records, archives and living memory are then brought into play so that the person can be identified and the plot correctly recorded for posterity.

# The Plots Thicken

The burial list at the historic Meekatharra cemetery has been updated, and once again our visitor season has brought several amateur genealogists through the freshly painted gates. The Shire is pleased at the progress of works at the cemetery, where a number of improvements are under way as well as an ongoing tidy-up of the surrounds.

Every year we receive quite a number of visitors researching their family pasts, and it is always rewarding when we are able to locate records, plots and even living memories to contribute to their efforts. Friday evening at one of our pubs can be a rich source of tales tall and true if you are looking up family members or old mates, and you'll be surprised at what you can find at our small but fascinating Museum, currently located at the Shire Office.

Meekatharra also has a number of Facebook pages where you can enquire about connections, and the Shire is always happy to help spread the word on your behalf. The Meekatharra News and History Hub Facebook page is a wealth of old photos, names and memories, and The Meekatharra Dust offers more recent photos and events.



A cheerful entrance to a sombre place – the historic Meekatharra cemetery could tell a hundred tales of outback generations. The new paint scheme is based on the Shire's theme colours of our soil and sun. The burial list, located in the left hand shelter, has been recently updated, with plenty of space for more. As they say, "Such is life!"

## MEEKATHARRA POLICE



Gunja – Messes with your mind – A Message from Meekatharra Police

The trick to leading a happy and healthy life, is engaging in activ-

ities, being with your family, country and community. Meekatharra Police want to encourage young people to join in on any community activities, family hunting trips, sports and school activities, rather than coping in less healthy ways.

If you know a young person or a family who is affected by cannabis use, please help them to understand the harm that this can cause, direct them to seek help and encourage any young people you know to have a yarn or join in on any family or group activities so that they are aware of the alternatives to cannabis use.

Cannabis use can increase the risk of mental health problems, especially in young people. This risk increases with frequency and amount of cannabis use and can cause anxiety, depression, paranoia and psychosis in those people who have a vulnerability to mental health problems. Cannabis can affect the brain by decreasing the user's ability to concentrate and remember things, and can also impact on learning ability. Frequent use of cannabis can increase the risk of cancer and respiratory disorders such as asthma, bronchitis and emphysema. Because cannabis is harmful, it is against the law for people in Western Australia to cultivate, possess, use, sell or supply cannabis. The possession of even small amounts of cannabis is still an offence. People apprehended for simple cannabis offences by police may be issued a Cannabis Intervention Requirement, where the person is required to book and complete a Cannabis Intervention Session or elect to have the matter heard in court. More serious cannabis offences may result in a person being sent to court.

There are a variety of treatment pathways available for people with cannabis related problems. In town, we have a drug and alcohol counsellor who may be able to help, Tracey Saylor at the Community Alcohol and Drug Service on 99810635.

We need the community to work together to help minimise the harm. If you know someone who supplies a prohibited drug to a young person or sells to anyone, you can call Meekatharra Police on 99811007 or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.





Containers for Change is coming to Meekatharra and Yulella Aboriginal Corporation and the ABC Foundation Ltd is bringing it here from Saturday October 3!

A new state-wide container deposit scheme, Containers for Change lets you cash in eligible containers for 10-cents each.

Your local refund point in Meekatharra is: 18 Marmont Street, Meekatharra.

Open: Wednesdays 1.00pm-5.00pm & Saturdays 8.00am-12.00pm. (From Sat Oct 3)

You will be able to cash in up to 800 containers and receive up to \$80 cash-in-hand during these times. You can also have the money deposited straight into your bank account by signing up for a Scheme ID at www.containersforchange.com.au.

Anything more than \$80 will be deposited directly into your bank account via your Scheme ID, so make sure you sign up for one today!

Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible for a refund.

There are some drink containers that are not eligible for a refund. Generally, excluded containers are those that are less than 150ml and greater than 3L. Containers excluded include:

- Any plain milk containers
- Any glass containers which have contained wine or pure spirits
- Containers 1L or larger which have contained flavoured milk, pure fruit or vegetable juice
- All cordial or syrup containers
- Registered health tonics.

Any containers that are presented as either broken glass or damaged/cut containers will NOT be eligible for a refund. Light crushing of cans, plastics and liquid paperboard is acceptable.

Please remember when coming down to exchange your containers:

- Make sure they are CLEAN and cleared of any contamination. Contamination includes: sand, cigarette butts, sharps and lemon/lime, plus much more.
- Sort and count your containers before into their types (glass, aluminium, plastic etc) as this will assist us in processing your containers quicker.
- Be nice we are just starting out, so please be patient if we are a bit slow in the first days.

If you would like to bag up your containers for us to count and process later so you don't have to wait, just make sure to mark your bag clearly with your Scheme ID, Full Name and Contact Number. Alternatively, put your details on paper inside a sealed plastic sleave and pop that in your bag.

#### SUSTAINABLE EVENTS

How good was the festival! It was so great seeing the kids' radiantly happy faces and the swish adults all dressed up nicely for the Art Exhibition Cocktail Night and the Ball. Well done to Amy, Tralee and their team for pulling this off! It was great!

It was nice to be able to use reusable, proper crockery and cutlery at the Ball and for soup and dessert they had single use bowls that were made out of bamboo (a very fast, regrowing and compostable option) rather than plastic.

If you want to run your own event or party here are some great ideas to not only have a great time but to also try and be more sustainable:

Basically try and swap single use for reusable – it's easier on the planet and also easier on your wallet in the long term. If you don't want to buy it all outright see if you can borrow or hire it. Collectively we probably already have everything you'd need.

Use local suppliers as much as possible - it's easier said than done when you live in a remote Outback town such Meekatharra we do actually have a lot of stuff in town that we can use without having to drive to or order from the big smoke. Consider the travel miles of the products you're using. Coming all the

way from China or the US? Can you do without? Sometimes less is more.

Gone through a lot of trouble to make it all look nice and serve delicious food? Give it the honour it deserves and serve it on proper plates with proper cutlery rather than plastic. Yes it might mean having to do the dishes after-

wards or the next morning. If doing the dishes is really not possible then see if you can get compostable paper plates made out of bamboo.

Same goes for drinks: using proper glasses is so much nicer than the chuck away plastic variety.

Recycle beer stubbies and aluminium cans – either drop them off at your favourite local recycling centre or from now on you can also get 10 cents back through the container deposit scheme! Yippee!

Rather than using plastic water bottles, use tap or filtered water and add a slice of lemon.

Make your own candle holders — either just use a glass jar or food tin, perhaps paint or decorate it with some ribbons (you can drill some holes into the tin to create patterns and to let the light through), or you can use a Tetrapak (the packaging of long life / plant based milks, coconut water and stocks etc), peel the outer layer off, use a needle and toothpick to prick some holes in it and then stick a candle in it. The water-proof inner layer is wonderfully reflective and will enhance the candle light nicely and the whole packaging will keep the wind off the candle. Look up Tetrapak upcycling online, it's so good!

Make your own decoration: you can easily make bunting out of colourful magazine pictures or Tetrapak material. The very talented Kadi once cut out heaps of pretty butterflies and stuck them up on the walls – so simple and yet it adds such a nice touch – and she also made colourful streamers out of leftover fabric. Clever!



Paint your own signage: grab a pallet and write on it – this could be the menu or a greeting to your guests. Easy!

Swap balloons for bubbles. So much more fun plus getting soaped up can't hurt in corona virus times. (No, please do not take this as official health advice! Listen to the experts.) Or if you use balloons make sure you pop them and put them in the bin so they don't end up flying away and littering the environment. Be mindful of greenwashing – some brands of balloons are sold as biodegradable but they actually



while. At the end of their life compost them or find a friend who has a compost.

Use jars, Tetrapaks or bottles as vases. Finally that wine drinking habit is turning out to be useful!

hang around for a long time; do your research.

You (or your kids, put them to good use) can make confetti by hole punching dry leaves and scrap paper.

Organise the right amount of food. If you happen to overcater big time enable your guests to take the leftovers home – you might have some takeaway containers in the cupboard that can be re-used, or you can make little snackpacks out of Tetrapak (notice a trend here? Tetrapak upcycling might be the newest favourite hobby...:) ) If your guests are stuffed and there is so much food leftover see if you can give it away, e.g. to Mission Australia to be distributed in the town. Or if it's just scraps find someone with chickens or pigs or compost them. Food waste in landfill is a big contributor to greenhouse gases not to mention all the money and effort that went into making the food, so getting as much use as possible out of it is best for everyone – the people, the planet and the chickens.

If you're using flowers see if you or a friend can grow them yourself. That way they're as local as possible, have beautified the neighbourhood and supported the bees for a little bit. You can also consider using greenery – gum leaf branches can make great Australian themed decoration. Or just use whole potted plants and flowers rather than chopping them off. If you're buying flowers ask the florist if they can send long lasting flowers – that way they can keep on giving for a







The Meekatharra Surf club held a chocolate wheel to tempt those who were not so lucky with the horses.


On Sunday the Gymkhana took place. Apparently this was a small meeting taking place for the Sandstone Gymkhana, which was postponed earlier in the year.




